"I've Got Something on my Mind" Program Planning

DPCAC members reviewed group mission and purposes, as well as meeting topic history for DPCAC and other CACs in the area. Each small group brainstormed topics they would like addressed in the coming year. Facilitator Sheridan started posting topics on flip chart pages, asking each group for their list. After all ideas were posted, attendees used sticky dots to prioritize the topics they most wanted to address in the coming year. Community and plant reps used different colored stickers so they could be tallied separately. Community points are prioritized at the top of the list. **The list is attached at the end of the meeting notes.** Community members Sherry Garrison, John Garrett, and Ruth Boyd, and plant representatives Jeff Lichon and Amanda Accardo, volunteered to serve on the Program Planning Committee. The committee will meet to draft a program plan based on the group input. Once reviewed and adopted by DPCAC, it will form the basis of the agendas for meetings in 2018 and early 2019.

Updates

Question of the Month: Texas Molecular and Valvoline

"How does a hazardous waste treatment facility know what a customer sends to them for disposal at their facility?" and "How do local chemical plants safeguard their critical processes and hazardous materials?" Level 3 (Warning) or Level 2 (Watch) Incidents

Amanda Accardo from Shell reported a Level 2 event on February 4th, when there was a cumene/toluene leak from a tank to the South Effluent Treater. The leak was isolated, investigated and found to be caused by an equipment failure. Mitigations are now in place. There was also a Level 3 event, on March 9th, when an operator reported a sheen on the Houston Ship Channel. A leak was identified on a crude line. A ½ cup of kerosene was estimated to have dripped into the Houston Ship Channel. Absorbent boom was placed on the concrete platform to contain any hydrocarbons. The cause of the leak was corrosion under insulation. The line has been removed from service for repair.

Written Facility Updates:

- OxyVinyls Matt Sexton reported their Deer Park PVC/KOH and VCM sites had no recordable worker or process safety incidents in the reporting period (September 7, 2017 March 5, 2018). The Deer Park PVC/KOH site did have one environmental incident in January, when freeze conditions caused loss of steam and the inability to process wastewater. Two greater than reportable quantity releases of vinyl chloride monomer (72.9 lbs. and 57.6 lbs.) occurred while the wastewater was being held in the reactors. There was no injury or offsite impact. The Deer Park VCM site also experienced one environmental event, when a greater than reportable quantity of ethylene (4400 lbs.) was released from the emergency vent scrubber due to a premature failure of a rupture disk in the ethylene recycle compressor system. There was no injury or offsite impact.
- Texas Molecular Deer Park Frank Marine reported the Deer Park site had no reportable spills or releases during the reporting period (September 26, 2017 March 26, 2018), and they have gone 4,069 days without any lost time accidents. One OSHA recordable incident occurred in March 2018 when a camlock connection failed and an operator was splashed with acid resulting in a small scratch to the eye. The Experience Modification Rate (EMR) for the Deer Park site has dropped to 0.63 (lower than 1.0 is considered good), and their Total Recordable Incident Rate (TRIR) was 2.24 for 2017.

Other Plant Updates:

Amanda Accardo from Shell reported their site will soon begin a turnaround, and the community may notice hydrogen flaring (produces water) for approximately 30 days.

Ozone Exceedance Days:

Sheridan relayed a report from Corbett Brinley that there had been no ozone exceedance days since the last meeting.

CAER Online:

Sheridan reminded everyone that the new CAER Online app is available. Anyone with feedback is welcome to contact Sheridan, who will relay that information to the committee. CAER Online developers are working on a system to archive messages for a reasonable amount of time.

Community Updates:

Norma Hysler reminded attendees that the Local Emergency Planning Committee monthly meeting is March 27th. Hysler serves as the DPCAC representative on the LEPC, and members are encouraged to contact her to relay messages to the committee as needed.
