- DPCAC programs should carry out our mission and purposes and in some way be related to the industry the group was formed to advise. So, we begin Program Planning by reviewing our mission and purposes.
- DPCAC was founded in 1990. Our paragraph-a-month history begins in 1996. Each small group will review 2-3 years of the history to see if previous topics should be revisited.
- Diane facilitates 7 groups like DPCAC. Each small group will look at the Program Plan of another CAC to see if the topics they are working on are also of relevance in Deer Park.
- Each small group will then brainstorm other topics they would like addressed in the coming year. Attendees are encouraged to bring others' ideas in addition to their own.
- The facilitator will then ask small groups to say what to post on easel pads.
- After all ideas are posted, attendees will use sticky dots to indicate the topics they most want to address in the coming year. Community and plant reps will be tallied separately so that community points drive what ends up at the top of the list.
- A Program Planning Committee will be formed to draft a Program Plan based on this input. It will be reviewed and adopted at the following DPCAC meeting. It will then form the basis of the agendas for meetings in 2018 and early 2019.
